A Step Forward

Visitors will sometimes notice that the stairway going down to the lower level Farrell and Ann Gay Museum of Springfield History is not as brightly lit as it is at other times. This problem results from the late season, and / or cloudy days, when not as much light comes in the two east-facing windows.

The house did not always have this feature. The original back door was right there at the top of the basement stairs — you can see today that a fill-in panel occupies that frame. When the current back porch was added around 2002, to accommodate the elevator, we lost that door-light. Now, thanks to the handywork of Logan McMinn and Dave Barringer, the steps leading downstairs have new traction strips on them, and the lighting overhead has been improved. Thank you, handymen.
